- What Treasure is of No Value? Luke 12:21 "So is he, who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God."
 - You can't take it with you if it's been corrupted.
- What Treasure is of Great Value? Mathew 6:20 "but lay up for yourselves treasure in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal."

 You won't leave it behind if it's been purified.
- Which is Treasure and which is Trash? Philippians 3:7-11 But what things were gain to me, these I have counted (as) loss for Christ... and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ...

Treasure is of God. Trash is of the world.

It's been said that "One man's trash is another man's treasure." There is no such confusion when God looks at things. To know what He thinks; pursue Him. To pursue Him; get into His word and get into Jesus.

 Seek Spirit over flesh..
- The Crown of Life celebrate; LIFE OVER DEATH. James 1:12 Blessed is the man who endures temptation. For when he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life which the Lord has promised to those who love Him. Life is the promised-reward made to believers who stand and do not fail through the trials of life. The King is alive... and so are you!
- The Crown of Glory celebrates; A JOB WELL DONE.

 1 Peter 5:1-4.elders... Shepherd the flock... when he chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that does not fade away. Leaders in the church have a high accountability with high rewards. Serve the people of God to receive His affirmation.

 Serve God and His people.
- Crown of Rejoicing celebrates; JOY IN THE LORD. 1 Thessalonians 2:19-20 For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of rejoicing? ... You in the presence of our Lord at His coming. There is no greater reason to rejoice than the presence of Jesus in our lives and in the lives of those whom we love. Allow Him in everyday.
